Scout must complete all class requirements plus any pre-requisites according to the counselor to properly earn the merit badge.

The counselor assigned to each class will be the one to sign off on the requirements to earn that badge.

SOME badges might require to meet more than others. Some might be 2-3 meeting times and others might be more. Just depends on the amount of requirements.

Bike for Life Service Project- From Austin and Mr. Weaver

Here is the link to the sign up genius for the Bike for Life service project that Austin discussed last Sunday. We are limited to 10 scouts/adults per stop due to Covid-19 restrictions. We have helped man the stops where the scouts hand out water and food/snacks to the riders at the two stop locations. There have been some changes this year as far as where the riders will start so Austin modified the stations and time slots accordingly. We will have 3 groups or slots that need to be manned during the event - 2 slots at the old Homemade Ice Cream and Pie Kitchen located in Prospect and one in Norton Commons. We will need the first stop to pick the gear needed for the station at Mr. Malone's house and then have at least one scout family stay until the second group for that station arrives to man the return riders from the longer route that takes them to Norton Commons.

The two bike ride routes we will service are a 23 and 53 mile route. The 23 mile route will turn around at the first stop while the other group will continue on to Norton Commons and return back through the Homemade Ice Cream and Pie Kitchen stop. The times for each slot are on the sign up genius. We will need someone with a truck or van at each of the stops to deliver or return the equipment to Mr. Malone's house.

Scouts will need to wear masks when they are handing out refreshments and anytime they are closer than 6ft. Lets help out this wonderful cause/fundraiser with our service as scouts.
