ZIPLINE TRIP UPDATES

9/1/20



Hello Everyone!!! I hope you all are doing well! I am sending this to let you guys know all of the details that I promised you at the Court of Honor for the October Zipline trip.

First, I want to remind everyone that if you have not signed up yet, you should do so as soon as possible because I will have to make reservations earlier than usual. That means that the sign up will be closing on September 13th, and I **WON'T BE ABLE** to take any sign ups after that date. If you have not signed up yet, the link for the signup genius is attached [here](#).



The next thing I need to know is who needs cooking requirements so I can get them in charge of the meal patrols. If you need a requirement like this for a rank or merit badge, you can email me [here](#). I will need to know all the meal patrol leaders by 9/20/20 so I can put together these patrols. The meal patrols will then come out through email on 9/26/20 and we will meet with our meal patrols during the meeting on 9/27/20. This will be the week after the backpacking trip. You will not be eligible to be a meal patrol leader if you are not signed up for the trip by the deadline. In the event we do not have enough meal leaders than other scouts that are going on the trip will be asked to lead a meal patrol.



Now we will talk about the cost. The cost for all of this is approximately \$100.00 per person. This trip might be more expensive than most trips, but you are getting a great experience, and I think you will get the most out of your money! The cost will include 2 nights of camping, 12 ziplines, and 1 free fall. Before signing up, you are also going to want to look at the requirements you must meet [here](#) (along with the dress code). Of course we will be talking about camping as well. We will be staying at Three Springs Campground while we are not ziplining. Camping is included in the price I listed above. All merit badges will be taught at St. Patrick cafeteria unless otherwise stated in the newsletter. Occasionally, a counselor might decide to go outside cafeteria in order to properly teach some of the merit badge requirements. Watch the newsletter for additional information on each class.

Scout must complete all class requirements plus any pre-requisites according to the counselor to properly earn the merit badge.

All pre-reqs will be listed in the newsletter prior to each month.

Pre-reqs should be done PRIOR to the first meeting.

The counselor assigned to each class will be the one to sign off on the requirements to earn that badge.

SOME badges might require to meet more than others. Some might be 2-3 meeting times and others might be more. Just depends on the amount of requirements.

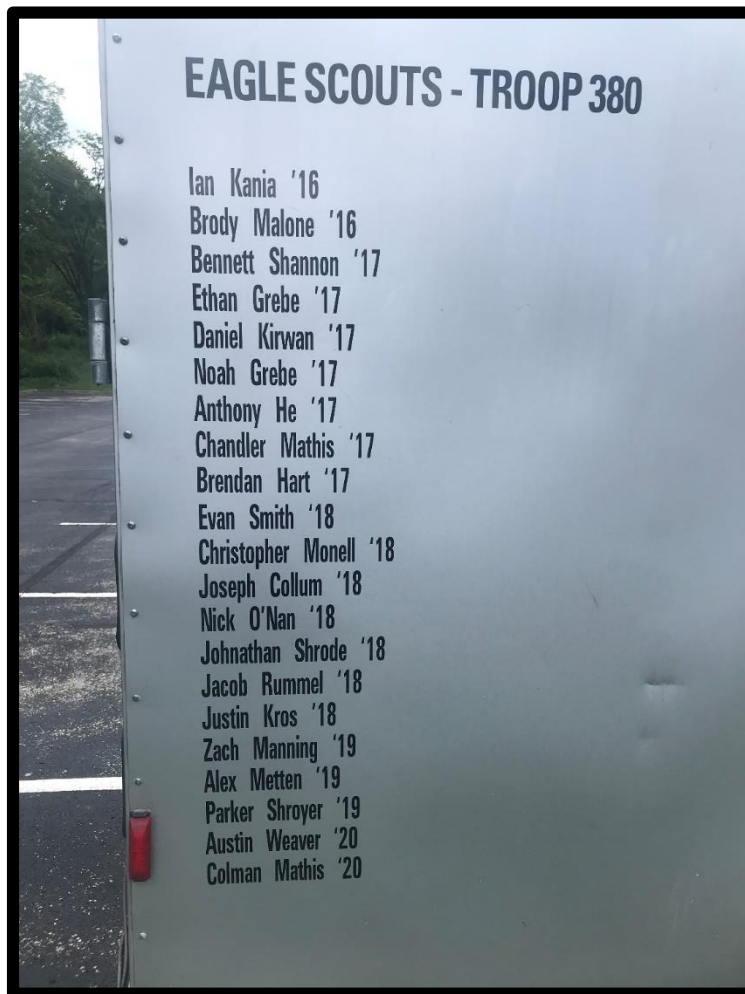

Three Months Out

- Assign youth and adult coordinators.
- Confirm dates and times.
- Reserve campsite.
- Recruit program specialists (e.g., certified COPE instructor).

Two Months Out

- Plan the budget; set the price.
- Submit required forms (e.g., campsite reservation, fishing and boating licenses).
- Begin promotion.
- Plan special training or shakedown, including troop meeting content.
- Begin signups and distribute permission slips, including those required by outfitters.
- Begin recruiting adult leaders and drivers.

One Month Out

- Finalize the activity plan, including a schedule.
- Collect any missing Annual Health and Medical Record forms.
- Begin teaching needed skills at troop meetings.
- Ensure at least one leader has training in basic first aid (wilderness first aid for backcountry trips), hazardous weather, and—depending on the activity—Safe Swim Defense, Safety Afloat, and/or Climb On Safely.
- Complete and submit a tour and activity plan.
- Continue promotion.
- Secure any special troop and patrol equipment (e.g., canoes, climbing gear).

Two Weeks Out

- Make sure you have enough drivers and enough gear haulers.
- Check the route and prepare maps as needed.
- Confirm the location of rest stops on long trips. (Groups should not travel in tight convoys.)
- Confirm the nearest medical facility and emergency phone number.
- Confirm the campsite contact and phone number.
- Prepare rainy-day activities.

One Week Out

- Confirm Scout and adult attendance.
- Collect permission slips.
- Confirm the campsite reservation.
- Confirm the participation of program specialists.
- Have patrols plan menus, assign shopping duties, and prepare duty rosters.
- Assemble troop and patrol equipment.
- Do a personal gear shakedown, if necessary.
- Check the weather forecast.
- Announce the departure and arrival times, if not already announced.

Day of Outing

- Do a final gear and food check.
- Distribute emergency contact information to parents.
- Share travel plans with someone who is staying behind.
- Leave on time, have fun, and be safe.
